Conclusions Stable isotopes show seasonal variations: indicate fast flow Clear isotopic difference of springs: indicate elevation signal Previous local meteoric water lines could not be confirmed and snow melt contribution is important Mean catchment elevation for Jeita is higher than 1300 m asl Groundwater residence times between 1 and 5 years German Federal Institute for decidence and federal federal for decidence and federal federal
