

- The interdependency of our water resources calls for cooperation







Importance of the Lower Jordan River

- Holy to Christians; important to Jews and Muslims
- Rich in cultural, historical heritage
- 'Out of Africa'... through the Valley
- Meeting point for flora and fauna of three continents
- Migratory flyway for 500 million birds biannually

The "mighty" Jordan... "deep and wide"

- Average annual flow of over 1.3 billion cubic meters
- Supported a wide variety of habitats/rich biodiversity

Lower Jordan River – now...






No longer "mighty"... nor "deep and wide"

- 96% of flow diverted
- Polluted sewage, saline springs, agricultural runoff
- Closed border area
- Minefields, military checkpoints and fences...








NGO Regional Master Plan

- Prepared by Dutch experts from RHDHV, and local partners.
- Akin to a Marshal Plan, this plan aims to convert a polluted river and highly depressed economic area to a model for river rehabilitation, economic growth, and regional stability.
- > 127 "interventions" (projects) identified; at a cost of \$4.5 Billion
- EcoPeace has been working vis-a-vis the Jordanian, Palestinian and Israeli governments to achieve a consensus around a selected list of interventions that can move forward now....





Already a change of momentum

- As of May 2013, the Israeli Water Authority is allowing 9 mcm / year of fresh water to flow regularly from the Sea of Galilee into the Lower Jordan River, in an effort to ecologically rehabilitate the river...
- ➤ 3 new Waste Water Treatment Plants have been built; in Israel, Jordan and Palestine, all in proximity to the River. Sewage from the surrounding communities need no longer be discharged into the River.
- Ecological rehabilitation: restoring habitats to help reverse some of the 50% biodiversity loss.
