

Sector Financing Challenge

- WASH = 23.4% of total infrastructure investments in Africa
- Minimum financing needs for WASH estimates at \$56-\$66 bn/year
- Average commitments for WASH is \$11 bn per year (2012 – 2017)
 Financing gap is 81%

Sanitation financing as a proportion of WASH expenditure can be as low as 2% and typically under 40%

3 - Support Operations Sovereign upon Regional Member Countries' demand



- Grants, concessional and non-concessional loans for investments in WASH infrastructure dev. and institutional capacity development. Helps mobilize climate funds
- Between 2010 and 2020, Bank invested \$
 6.31 b in WASH services delivery.
